Catalog Description

The Oakland Fire Training Institute offers full-time and part-time Fire Fighter I & II training programs. These programs are designed to place well trained firefighter recruits into the fire suppression field. All requirements of the Michigan Fire Fighter Training Council Fire Fighter I & II programs will be met and exceeded. The Office of Fire Fighter Training is the regulating agency for the State of Michigan under the Bureau of Construction Codes & Fire Safety. The Office of Fire Fighter Training oversees the written and practical examinations that are conducted at the end of each program. Upon receiving a passing examination score, the trainee will be awarded a Fire Fighter I & II certificate of completion. State certification, as awarded by the Office of Fire Fighter Training, is received after the trainee becomes a member of an organized fire department.
