## General Safety Tips

- *Call Oakland County Sheriff's Office Dispatch Center to request an OCC Public Safety escort to your car:*

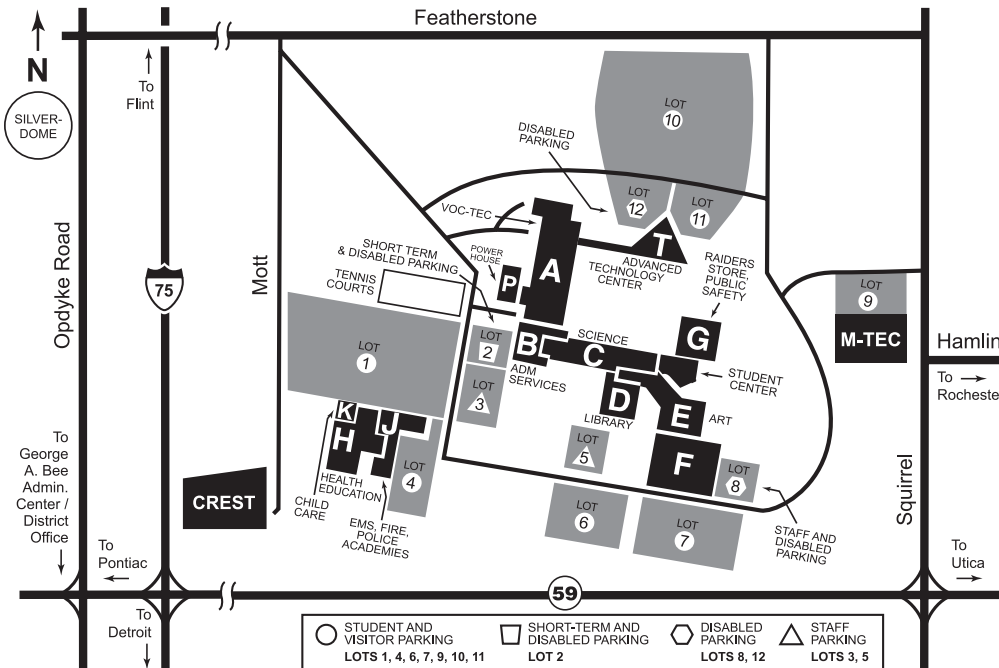

*Public Safety requests are prioritized as to degree of urgency, so if you request an escort, be prepared to wait until an officer is available.*



# Auburn Hills Campus Parking Guide



## Tips for Finding a Parking Spot at the Auburn Hills Campus

- Register and pay by Touch\*Tone to avoid coming to campus during peak registration times.
- Consult this map for the lots that are available to you.
- Allow 20-25 minutes to park and get to class, especially during the first few weeks of the semester.
- **PEAK TIMES – MID-MORNING AND EVENINGS.**  
Avoid Lots 1, 6 and 7. Vacant spots are few at peak times, and circling generally produces only traffic congestion and driver frustration.

Park in Lot 9 near M-TEC or Lot 10 near Featherstone Road

- **Parking is almost always available in these lots.**
- Lots 9 and 10 are no further from many classrooms than Lots 1, 6 and 7.
- You can walk comfortably to class through interconnected buildings. **Buildings A, B, C, D, E, and F are interconnected and G is only steps away from other buildings.**

**TRY THIS: PARK IN LOT 10 AND ENTER BUILDING T.  
THEN WALK TO CLASS THROUGH INTERCONNECTED BUILDINGS.  
It's just a 10-minute walk from Lot 10 to Building F  
and just 5 minutes to Building B!**

- Be aware that Public Safety officers will ticket cars parked illegally, even during peak times. This is necessary in order to maintain safe and adequate access to campus.

### A note to our students about parking

Parking continues to be a challenge at the Auburn Hills Campus at certain times of the day and in the evening. Peak times are mid-morning and evenings. The problem is especially severe at the beginning of each semester when students are also at the campus to buy books, adjust their schedules and to finalize financial arrangements.

This guide is designed to help ease parking difficulties. If you follow its suggestions, you should be able to find a suitable parking spot and get to class on time.
