



**Dr Danny D. Greig II, MD**  
Emergency Medicine Physician  
**Oakland Community College**  
**Outstanding Alumnus 1998**

Danny D. Greig II, M.D. had a desire to become a physician even during his time in high school where he discovered an interest in the sciences of Biology and Medicine. He entered Oakland Community College immediately upon completion of high school in 1987 with that goal in mind. He studied the basic sciences needed in a pre-med curriculum while at OCC to lay the groundwork for a transfer to a four-year University.

He attended OCC from September of 1987 to January of 1989 where he was on the Deans list each semester with an overall GPA of 3.92. He was the first ever winner of both the outstanding Physics student and outstanding Chemistry student awards at Highland Lakes Campus. In January of 1989 Dr. Greig transferred a full two years worth of credit hours to the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor where he graduated Summa Cum Laude with a degree in Biology in the summer of 1990 completing a four-year degree in less than three years. He began Medical school in August of 1990 at Wayne State University School of Medicine graduating in the top quarter of his class in 1994 at the age of 24.

Dr. Greig completed his Residency in Family Practice at the Mid-Michigan Medical Center in Midland, MI in 1997. While in residency he was elected chief resident in 1997. He also won the Dr. Harry A. Towsley award for outstanding resident as well as a national award from the Society of Teachers of Family Medicine as the outstanding resident teacher for 1997. He also completed a post-Doctoral fellowship in Academic Medicine through the Michigan State University School of Medicine in 1998.

He then went on to work at the residency faculty at Mid-Michigan Medical Center for two years before joining the Emergency Medicine Group at that hospital. He has now been a full time Emergency Room Physician for the last six years.

He currently has memberships in the following associations: Michigan Academy of Family Physicians, American Academy of Family Physicians, Michigan College of Emergency Physicians and American College of Emergency Physicians.

Dr. Greig has been active in the political Arena in Medicine having served on the board of directors of the Michigan Academy of Family Physicians since 1997. His main interests are increasing access to health care for all and preserving the practice of Family Medicine.

Dr. Greig was elected President of the Michigan Academy of Family Physicians in 2003 at the age of 33, the youngest-ever president of that organization.

Dr. Greig has been married to his wife Kristine for 14 years. They live in Midland with their three children Danny, 11, Kristofer, 10 and Grace, 8.
