HIBAKUSHA: HIDDEN SCARS OF AMERICA'S "GOOD WAR"

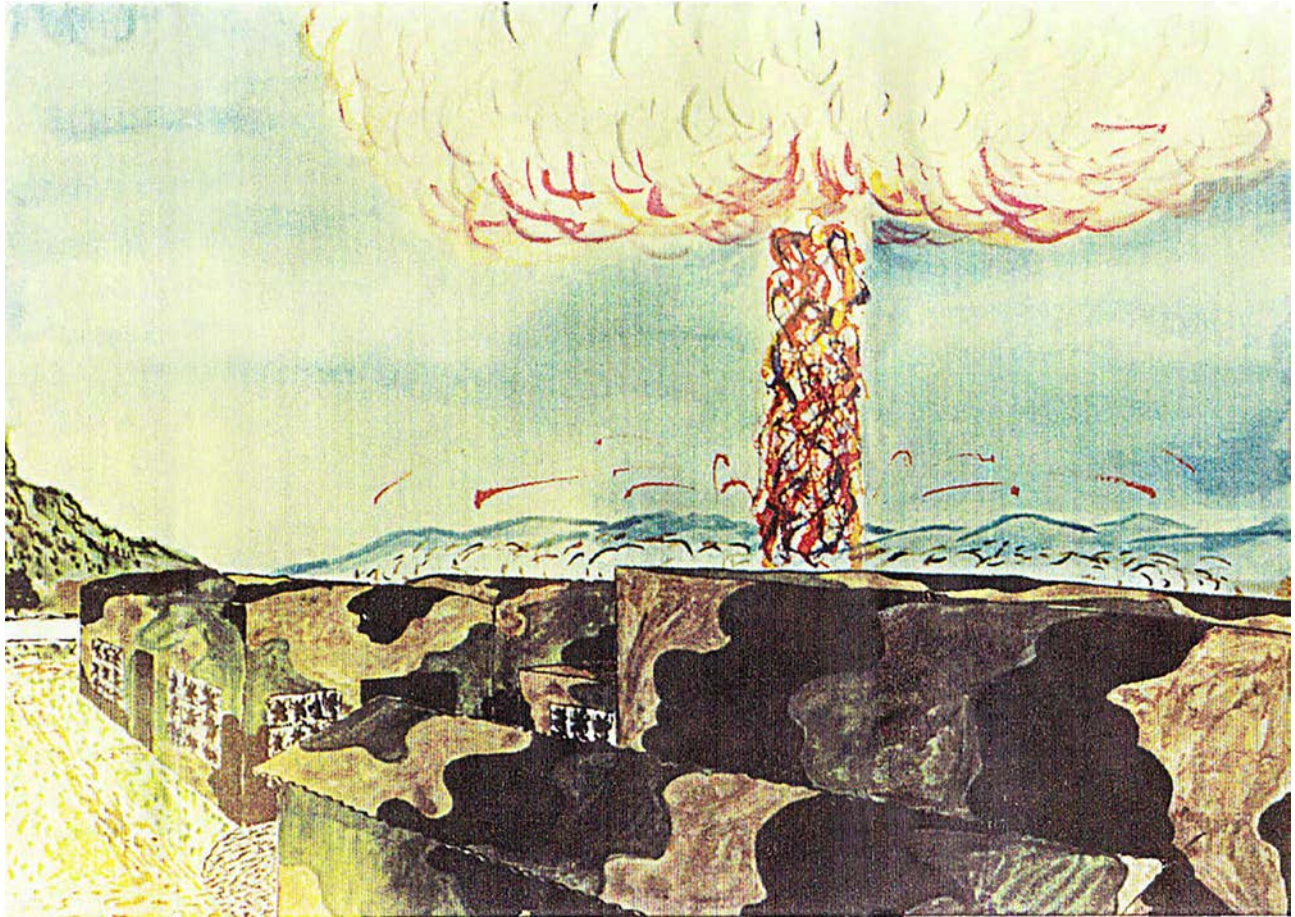


Image courtesy of Jack Motoo Dairiki, American survivor of the atomic bombing in Hiroshima, Japan, August 6, 1945.
