What Every Officer Needs to Know!

INSTRUCTOR: Danny Rosa is a highly motivated Law Enforcement Training Specialist with 20 years of experience researching and developing mandatory statewide standards and identifying best practices for the law enforcement regulatory agency in a Midwest State. Danny previously spent over 15 years as a sworn officer with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department (LASD) in California, where he was recognized as an expert in the use of force, criminal street gangs, and the street sales of illegal narcotics. Danny has been involved in numerous life-threatening situations, including officer-involved-shootings, and brings practical experience and credibility to this training.

COURSE DESCRIPTION: Officers are often forced to make quick decisions that can cause lifelong ramifications for everyone involved. The ramifications of decision-making are magnified exponentially when the decision confronting the officer is whether to use force, especially deadly force.

This training highlights findings of cognitive scientists on how the human brain makes decisions. This training connects the brain research directly to decision-making and law enforcement training in a practical manner that officers and administrators can relate to. This interactive training explores decisions and judgment in the context of law enforcement authority, the "objectively reasonable" standard of force, implicit bias, officer safety, de-escalation, and other fundamental concepts critical to surviving and excelling in the law enforcement profession. This training is constantly updated based on continuing research and current events.

AM Session: The practical application of brain research as it relates to decision-making, including how our unconscious brain influences judgment and behavior.

PM Session: The legal issues surrounding the use of force and the practical application of the "objectively reasonable" standard that governs all force.
