THE TRADITION OF THE NURSING PIN



A badge or pin represents recognition of a certain degree of accomplishment.

The earliest badges given to those who tended the sick were presented to members of the Knights of the Order of St. John the Baptist in the 12th century.

The tradition of the nursing pin and the ceremonial pinning originated in the 1860s at the Nightingale School of Nursing at St. Thomas Hospital in London. Florence Nightingale, having been recently awarded The Red Cross of St. George for her selfless service to the injured and dying in the Crimean War, chose to extend the honor to her most outstanding graduate nurses by presenting each of them with a medal for excellence.

Today, the nursing pin remains a symbolic medal of honor as well as a badge of courage – qualities that are at the very foundation of nursing. The graduates here today will bear the pin of Oakland Community College. A pin that marks the completion of a program that began in 1965 and continues today with recognition and pride.

THE SYMBOLISM OF THE OAKLAND COMMUNITY COLLEGE ADN NURSING PIN

The pin that the Associate Degree Nurse graduates receive today symbolizes many things. First of all, the gold represents rarity. Not everyone can be a nurse.

The circle represents the profession of nursing. No two points around the circumference share the same space, which depicts the diversity and variety found in nursing. Still, being a circle, each point is the same distance from the center, which is the Standards of Care and Standards of Professional Practice honored by all nurses regardless of specialty.

The triangle within the circle represents the three community values of Oakland Community College. They are: 1) shared responsibility, open communication, collaboration; 2) personal empowerment, integrity, ethical commitment; and 3) diversity, global awareness, responsiveness to community needs.

The initials "OCC" and the words "Oakland Community College" represent the fact that graduates have come from an institution which "provides quality learning opportunities for individuals on an accessible, affordable basis."

The banner reading "Associate Degree Nurse" identifies the educational program from which the nurses have graduated.

In addition to the meaning of each of the pin's components, the pin taken as a whole symbolizes to each graduate pride in the high standards of the Oakland Community College Nursing Program and success in achieving the goal of completion.
