Reverse Transfer Agreement

Oakland Community College and Wayne State University

 This agreement is designed to facilitate the reverse transfer of credit from Wayne State University to Oakland Community College for students who have transferred from Oakland Community College for the awarding of the associate degree.

Oakland Community College and WSU will maintain the integrity of their separate requirements and enter into this agreement as cooperating institutions.

- a. At the end of each academic year (Fall and Winter semesters) WSU will provide Oakland Community College with names and contact information for students who:
 - transferred from Oakland Community College and attended Wayne State University during that academic year
 - 2. transferred with a minimum of 40 credits from Oakland Community College without an associate's degree having been awarded at Oakland Community College.
 - 3. have completed 35 resident credits at WSU and have not completed a bachelor's degree at WSU. {N.B., for students enrolled under the concurrent enrollment Wayne Direct program with Oakland Community College, all academic data will be exchanged automatically each semester as specified by the WayneDirect agreement.}
- b. Oakland Community College will notify these students of their potential eligibility to receive an associate's degree for coursework successfully completed at the community college and WSU. Oakland Community College will provide information on the associate degree application process. The notification will include the information that submission of the associate degree application will serve as the student's simultaneous approval and/or consent for WSU to release the student's WSU transcript to Oakland Community College.
- c. Oakland Community College will request WSU transcripts for students who complete the associate degree application. WSU will provide the requested transcripts to Oakland Community College {unless already provided through a WayneDirect agreement.} Students must be eligible to have official transcripts sent, e.g., not have an outstanding financial obligation to WSU.
- d. Oakland Community College will evaluate the WSU credit(s) earned, in combination with the Oakland Community College credit(s) earned and notify the students as to the outcome of the degree application.
- e. All advising for reverse transfer students seeking the Oakland Community College associate degree will be provided by Oakland Community College.

- II. Each signatory of this agreement agrees to:
 - a. Share student information in a manner that complies with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act guidelines, parameters of the law, and regional accrediting agencies;
 - b. Develop a method to track the success of the initiative and share results on an annual basis;
 - c. Develop and document, and share the system, processes, and communication supporting the agreement; and
 - d. Maintain and house a copy of this document in their respective offices.
 - e. Consider electronic exchange of academic data for students moving between Wayne State University and Oakland Community College.
- III. Qualified students applying to Oakland Community College or WSU during or after the semester of this document's signing shall be considered under this agreement.
- IV. This agreement shall remain in effect until such time as either party wishes to terminate; notice of termination shall be given in writing at least 120 days prior to the effective date of termination.
